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MEDICAL COVER STANDING ORDERS

**OFFICER IN CHARGE
MEDICAL TEAM:**

The OiC Medical Team will be appointed by the MSSCHQ Events Officer, prior to the event.

**THE MEDICAL
OFFICER SHALL BE
RESPONSIBLE FOR:**

- a. He / she is responsible to the OiC Training Venue for the reception of Unit sick personnel ensuring that all sick and injured CFAVs and Cadets are examined and treated without delay, and if necessary, evacuated to a hospital, and to complete B1510 Accident Report Book and MoD Form 492, (which is to be completed for each accident and incident).
- b. The Medical Officer is to ensure that all Medical Staff are suitably qualified.
- c. Where medical/legal interests or disciplinary interests are involved these matters are to be reported to the CRSM as soon as possible.
- d. The Medical Officer is responsible for the Duty Medical Staff Roster, which is too submitted to the CRSM ASAP.
- e. The Medical Officer is to ensure that the OOW and Duty CFAVs are aware of the Duty Medic's location at all times. The Duty Medic(s) are to sleep in the Medical Centre.
- f. During their tour of duty he/she is not permitted to leave the Unit confines unless this is medically unavoidable. If such an eventuality occurs he/she is to make arrangements for an emergency relief to cover in his/her absence.
- g. Every morning, the Medical Officer is to submit all B1510 Accident Report Form (s) and MoD Form 492 to the CRSM. These reports will then be handed to the OiC Training Venue by 0930 hrs.
- h. The Medical Officer is to view all T1s and inform their HoDs on any Medical & Welfare problems.

SICK BAY:

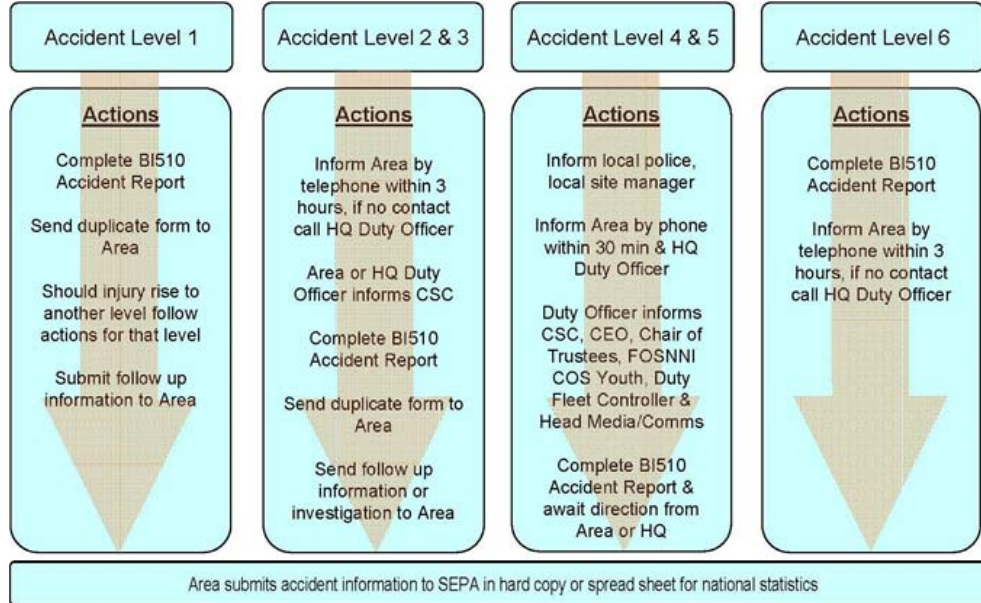
There are no dedicated sick bays within the Medical Centre. Patients who require to be kept in bed are to be sent to the nearest hospital.

GUIDANCE DEFINITIONS

Cadet/MSSC activities and participating in, plus travel to or from Cadet/MSSC activities.

ACCIDENT LEVEL LIST

1. Minor Injuries: Cuts, abrasions, mild knocks on head, muscle strain, mild sprains, minor medical event, fainting.
2. Serious Injuries: Breaks to fingers, thumbs, toes, foreign matter in eyes with little adverse effect, more serious cuts and wounds, breathing difficulties, serious sprains and dislocations, heavy blows to head, significant medical event, disease with rapid recovery.
3. Major Injuries: Breaks to main frame bones and arms and legs, eye injuries, unconsciousness but not fainting, serious bleeding, significant head injuries, retention in hospital, medical event requiring hospital attention, minor amputation, disease with prolonged recovery, heart or breathing difficulties.
4. Critical Injuries: Multiple fractures, injuries to key internal organs, serious head injuries, medical event requiring extended hospital stay, loss of sight, major amputation, loss of hearing, disease with lasting disability, serious heart or breathing difficulties, near drowning.
5. Death: Death through injury or medical event; the death, injury, medical event or the discovery of the onset of the medical event occurring during cadet activities.
6. Dangerous Occurrence: An event often causing damage to property, equipment or materials but for good fortune could have resulted in serious injuries or worse.
